Key findings - Internationa COVID-19 World Tourism Barometer

The year 2024 marks the recovery of international tourism

- International tourist arrivals reached 99% of 2019 levels in 2024, four years after the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, marking the recovery from the worst crisis in the sector's history.
- 1.4 billion tourists travelled internationally in 2024, about 11% more than in 2023 and virtually the same number as in 2019.
- Results were driven by strong post-pandemic demand across all regions, robust outbound travel from many large source markets and the ongoing recovery of Asia and the Pacific.
- The Middle East remained the best-performing region in 2024, with arrivals 32% above 2019 levels and 1% above 2023. Africa welcomed 7% more tourists than before the pandemic.
- Europe, the world's largest destination region, recorded 1% more international arrivals than in 2019. The Americas recovered 97% of its pre-pandemic arrivals (-3% over 2019) and Asia and the Pacific 87% (-13% over 2019).
- International tourism receipts continued growing strongly in 2024 to reach USD 1.6 trillion, according to preliminary estimates, a 3% increase from 2023 and 4% from 2019 (real terms).


- In 2025 arrivals are projected to grow 3% to 5% based on global economic forecasts, the outlook by the UN Tourism Panel of Experts, and the assumptions that economic conditions remain favorable, inflation continues to recede, and geopolitical conflicts do not escalate.




Recovery of international tourist arrivals, by region 2024*

Percentage not recovered










International tourist arrivals by region








Best-performing destinations in 2024*




Large* best-performing destinations in 2024






Best-performing destinations in Europe, 2024*










Best-performing destinations in Africa & Middle East in 2024*


Best-performing destinations in terms of receipts, 2024*







What are your prospects for your destination in 2025?










When do you expect international tourism to return to 2019 levels in your country?






Percentage of responses by world region


When do you expect international tourism to return to 2019 levels in your country?

What are the main challenges that international tourism will face in 2025?








